HOW TO USE THIS DOCUMENT

The primary objective of this document is to assess participant knowledge levels both prior to and following the training sessions provided. The ex-ante questionnaires are distributed to participants before the commencement of the training, enabling them to gauge their initial understanding and awareness of the subject matter. The ex-post questionnaires are disseminated after the completion of the training, with the intention of measuring the educational advancements and insights gained. Each questionnaire is crafted in alignment with the training materials and objective developed by UniSAFE, as <u>outlined in the UniSAFE Toolkit</u>. The training materials are: (1) Webinar for students without knowledge on gender-based violence; (2) Webinar for students with pre-knowledge on gender-based violence; (3) Webinar for doctoral students/researchers and early career researchers and (4) Webinar for Teachers in Higher Education Institutions and Research Organisations. To ensure confidentiality, the questionnaires are anonymised.
